East Coast Symposium 2009

The East Coast Section sponsored the 25th East Coast Symposium on April 17, 2009 at the USN Test Pilot School auditorium in Patuxent River, Maryland. This year's event was held at the home of Naval Aviation aircraft flight test in order to "Bring SETP to the testers." The East Coast Symposium is typically a one-day event that immediately follows the

USN Test Pilot School Alumni Association Reunion, so that members may easily attend both functions. The symposium was well attended, with over 200 members, USNTPS students and flight test professionals attending.

The morning kicked off with delicious continental breakfast followed by the technical session, which briefings included from government, industry, and academia featuring a unique look at the undergraduate aeronautical engineering curriculum at Daniel Webster College. The additional presentations covered the test team's results and lessons learned from flight test encompassing the MV-22 Osprey, EA-18G Growler, and the T-6A Texan.

The luncheon was held at the Patuxent River Officer's Club adjacent to the beautiful Chesapeake Bay. The guest speaker at our luncheon was NASA Astronaut CAPT Mike Foreman. CAPT Foreman provided an excellent presentation on his most recent space shuttle mission where STS-123. performed 3 space walks. His presentation featured exclusive video taken on board the multiple Extra-Vehicular Activity (EVA) Space Suits involved in the mission.

The afternoon technical session consisted of more outstanding presentations covering test programs for the E-2D Advanced Hawkeye, F-35 Lightning II, F-16 Falcon, and the VH-71 Presidential Helicopter. The papers concluded with a unique presentation from SETP President Greg Lewis on "The State of the Society."

The final event of the symposium was the cocktail reception held at the Patuxent River Naval Aviation Museum. The highlight of the reception was Les when Mr. Ryan (Northrop Grumman Test Pilot) had the honor of presenting the annual Leroy

Grumman Award to Mr. (Bell Martin Shubert Helicopter Textron), and Mr. Eggleston Gregory (NAVAIR) for their paper titled "MV-22B Airplane Mode External Ċargo Envelope Expansion and Correlations." Simulation The Leroy Grumman award sponsored by the Northrop Grumman Corporation to honor the speakers that present the best technical paper at the East Coast Symposium.

Flight Test Safety Committee Update May 2009

Flight Test Safety The Committee held the annual Flight Test Safety Workshop 27-30 April 2009 at The Westin Ottawa Hotel, Ottawa, Ontario, Canada. The purpose of the Safety Workshop is to provide an open forum where test safety issues can be presented, discussed, and probed with other members and disciplines of the flight test community. Maurice "Moe" Girard, Cessna Aircraft Aircraft Company coordinated the event with the assistance of The Society of Experimental Test Pilots (SETP), the Society of Flight Test Engineers (SFTE), Canadian Aerospace Forces Engineering Test Establishment (AETE) and the National Research Council (NRC), Canada.

A technical tour of the NRC operations and aircraft was arranged by Tim Leslie and Rob Erdos. The NRC tour was followed by lunch and a tour of the Canada Aviation Museum.

The FTSC sponsored a fullday Flight Test Safety Tutorial on the first day of the tutorial was titled "The Human-Machine" Human-Machine Interface and its Relationship to Understanding and Managing Human Error"." and was presented by Kathy H Abbott, PhD, FRAeS Chief Scientific and Technical Advisor Flight Human Factors. Deck Federal Aviation Administration, Robert Sumwalt, Board Member Transportation National Safety Board and Dr Scott Shappell, Professor, Industrial Engineering Department, Clemson University and co-developer Human Factors the Analysis and Classification System (HFACS). Over 90 attendees were treated to an engaging and realistic view of this critical issue. Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University awarded continuing education units for attendance of the tutorial and workshop.

Attendance at the technical program consisted of 110 registrants representing 7 countries. Of special note three past presidents of SETP; Jim Brown, Ricardo Traven and Rogers Smith with the current SFTE, Pete president of Donath were in attendance.

A Search For Test Pilot **Visual Records** (What's In Your Garage?)

Our test pilot history is a valuable resource for both members and non-members but there are two problems. First, these media virtually inaccessible in this world of the Internet and computer files. Secondly, sadly, the original material will deteriorate over time. Color shifts Kodachrome and Kodacolor films, acetic acid outgassing on 16mm films and storage

temps and humidity can have permanent, irreversible effects on these visual media. Our test pilot history can literally melt away.

The Society has a small collection of historically significant 16 mm films, 35mm slides, VHS and Beta tapes and still photographs and we have decided to begin the task of properly archiving the collection and digitizing it. then historical data will then be available to our members as legitimate as researchers. In addition, the original films, tapes and pictures will be professionally documented, stored properly preserve them controlled to make sure they don't "walk away" over time, yet remain available for use in projects which enhance the history and image of test pilots.

Most of us have collected similar test pilot "stuff" over the years that sits in boxes in garages, attics and related nooks and crannies.

This is a request to donate your private collections to the Society where it can be preserved and accessible in a digitized format for our members and non-members just as we currently do with our SETP papers.
